Aimee Reedy, Ed.D., M.P.H.

Prior to joining The Health Trust, Dr. Aimee Reedy was the Director of Community Research and Evaluation at the U.C. Berkley School of Public Health-Center for Public Health Practice and a private consultant. In both capacities, she worked with health departments and community organizations on applied research and evaluation projects with a focus on informing community health strategies and measuring progress toward health outcomes. Examples of her work include a qualitative study to inform a strategic plan to reduce health disparities affecting the African American population in Solano County, an evaluation of a community-wide effort to reduce hypertension among people living in South West Berkeley, an evaluation of the Steps to a Healthier Santa Clara County initiative, a case study of a community engagement project in San Jose, and planning for a county-wide Pandemic Influenza preparedness and response plan.

Prior to her work at U.C. Berkeley, Aimee held managerial and senior level positions for more than 10 years at the Santa Clara County Public Health Department. During her tenure with the Public Health Department, Aimee oversaw multiple community health planning initiatives in such areas as childhood immunization, adolescent pregnancy prevention, violence prevention, perinatal substance abuse, and traffic safe communities. She also established and directed the Division of Health Assessment and Quality Improvement, encompassing epidemiology and community health assessment, program evaluation, and departmental strategic planning. Aimee earned a Doctorate in Education from the University of San Francisco, and received the school's Outstanding Dissertation Award for her study on Latina mothers' self-efficacy for promoting their young children's development. Aimee received her Master's degree in Public Health in Health Policy and Administration from University of California, Berkeley and a B.S. in Special Education from University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.
